2 That save and except by three several Indentures of Mortgage and Further Charge dated respectively the 25th day of April 1884 the 1st day of February 1888 and the 29th day of January 1890 and made between me this Declarant of the one part and Richard Joynes Esq. of Sandwich in the said County of Kent Gentleman of the other part for securing the repayment of the several principal sums of £100, £50 and £50 and interest I have not at any time mortgaged charged sold or disposed of or done or executed any act deed matter or thing whatsoever in any way affecting the before mentioned part or share to which I am so entitled in remainder or reversion expectant as aforesaid or by reason whereof I am prevented from effectually conveying and assigning the same either subject to or discharged from the aforesaid Mortgage and Further Charges to any Purchaser thereof
