I am sorry I have not yet received the Valuations herein, but I hope to do so on Monday, when I will at once communicate with you as to the guarantee for Rent - as far as Sam concerned <sup>with</sup> will be done to prejudice your right of distraint.

The debtor informs me that

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the Rent due to Linas in respect of the Cottage is £10 - Is this Correct? Will you also kindly inform me <sup>the exact</sup> amount you claim for rent in respect of the other holding. The debtor holds 1 small piece of Land under an Agreement from his Father, under which agreement he is entitled to Compensation for unexhausted improvements.
