OFFICIAL RECEIVER'S OBSERVATIONS:—The Receiving Order was made on the debtor's petition.

The debtor commenced business in 1880 as a farmer, with a capital of £100, at Stourmouth, where he has continued to farm down to Michaelmas last, at which time he had three small fields in cultivation. At Michaelmas last he gave up Rookson Field, the valuation thereon for straw and manure amounting to £20 9s. 6d.—there is £31 18s. 10d. due for rent and tithe in respect of this field. The debtor claims a sum of £30 in respect of the unexhausted improvements, consisting of fruit trees and bushes planted by him in the School Field.

The debtor is cotitled to a reversionary interest in one-tenth of an estate at Preston, producing a gross rental of about £300 per annum, and one-tenth of a mortgage for £1,020 secured by a fourth mortgage upon property at Stourmouth subject to the life interest of his father therein, who is now aged 68. The debtor estimates the value of this reversion at £295; it is mortgaged for £282 19s. 4d.

The debtor has recently sold portions of his effects to his sister for £15, which he states he paid to his solicitor on account of the costs of filing the Petition. He has also recently sold a gun for £5. The debtor has not kept any books of account.
