I George Reader Dowker of Stourmouth in the  
bounty of Kent market gardener do solemnly and  
sincerely declare as follows:—

- 1 That under the Will of James Dowker late of Preston  
near Wingham in the bounty of Kent Farmer deceased  
dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of December 1856 and proved in the  
Prerogative Court of the Archbishop of Canterbury on  
the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of June 1857 I am entitled to one tenth  
part or share of and in the Real and Residuary  
Personal Estate of the said Testator in remainder or  
reversion expectant on the decease of my Father George  
Dowker
- 2 That save and except by three several Indentures of  
mortgage and Further Charge dated respectively the  
25<sup>th</sup> day of April 1884 the 1<sup>st</sup> day of February 1888 and  
the 29<sup>th</sup> day of January 1890 and made between me  
this Declarant of the one part and Richard Joynes  
Emmerson of Sandwich in the said bounty of Kent  
Gentleman of the other part for securing the repayment  
of the several principal sums of £100, £50 and £50  
and interest I have not at any time mortgaged charged  
sold or disposed of or done or executed any act deed  
matter or thing whatsoever in any way affecting the  
before mentioned part or share to which I am  
so entitled in remainder or reversion expectant  
as aforesaid or by reason whereof I am prevented  
from effectually conveying and assigning the  
same either subject to or discharged from  
the aforesaid mortgage and Further Charges  
to any Purchaser thereof

And I make this solemn Declaration
