Order XXV., Rule 31 (3).—In default of your attendance you will be liable to a fine of £10 under Section 111 of the County Courts Act, 1888, payment of which fine may, under Section 167 of the Act, be enforced, upon the Order of the Judge, in such manner as payment of a sum adjudged to be paid on summary conviction may be enforced under the Summary Jurisdiction Acts, that is to say, by distress and sale of your goods, or, in default or in lieu of distress, by imprisonment.

Hours of attendance at the Office of the Registrar, Park House, Park Street, Deal, from Ten till Four o'clock, except on Saturdays, when the Office will be closed at One o'clock; and at Harnet Street, Sandwich, from Ten till Four o'clock, on Mondays and Wednesdays only.
