When I saw the Debtor yesterday he informed me that when he married, the major portion of the furniture was a gift to, or settlement upon his Wife by her Father the late Rev E.W.L.Davis and that other furniture which (the Debtor) was possessed of, he settled on his Wife about a year after their marriage by a postnuptial settlement. He states that about 14 years later he compounded privately with his creditors at approximately 10/- in the £. In order to do this he obtained a loan of £410-giving as security a Bill of Sale over the household furniture, effects and plate to Mr A.K.Butterworth Solicitor, York and Mr G.M.Butterworth, Solicitor Swindon. I pointed out to him that apparently at that time he had no furniture or plate but he states the Bill of Sale was given in the above mentioned manner with the consent of his Wife. The Bill of Sale is dated 30th April 1896 and apparently duly re-registered. He further states that when giving up his practice about 11 years ago and going into a smaller house he was allowed by the Bill of Sale holder and his Wife to dispose of certain portions of the furniture and to use the proceeds for domestic purposes- that the remaining furniture now at Glenartney, Herschell Road, Walmer is still the subject of the Bill of Sale as no portion of the principal or interest has been repaid. The Debtor further informs me that his Wife has separate estate and that her Trustee is the before mentioned A.K.Butterworth Solicitor of York. Can you therefore as the Debtor's Solicitors kindly verify the above information, and at the same time would you be so good as to let me know whether the Debtor is now interested directly or indirectly in any of the above mentioned Beeds or Settlements.
