The Debtor informs that when he married, practically all the household furniture was a gift to, or settlement upon his Wife, by her Father the late Rev. E.W.L. Davis and that other furniture which he (the Debtor) was possessed of he settled on his Wife about a year after their marriage by a postnuptial settlement. He states that about 14 years later he compounded privately with his creditors at approximately 10/- in the £. In order to do this he obtained a loan of £410 - giving as security a Bill of Sale over the household furniture, effects and plate to you and to Mr. G. M. Butterworth, Solicitor, Swindon. I pointed out to him that apparantly in the circumstances at that time he had no furniture or plate, but he states the Bill of Sale was given in the above mentioned manner with the consent of his Wife. The Bill of Sale is dated 30th. April 1896. He further states that when giving up his practice about 11 years ago and going into a smaller house he was allowed by the Bill of Sale holders and his Wife to dispose of certain portions of the furniture and to use the proceeds for domestic purposes, that the remaining furniture now at Glenartney, Herschell Road, Walmer, is still the subject of the Bill of Sale as no portion of the principal or interest has been repaid. The Debtor further informa me that his Wife has separate estate and that you are her Trustee. Can you therefore kindly verify the above information ? and at the same time would you be so good as to let me know the position of the trusts &c. and whether the Debtor is now interested

directly or indirectly in any of the above mentioned Deeds of Settlement. If it can be conveniently arranged I should like to have the Deeds sent for my inspection and you can accept this letter as my undertaking to safely return any documents which you were feel disposed to send for my perusal.
