re Trollope

Referring to our conversation
yesterday as to the proposal made
in this matter, we are now
writing as to the terms on which
we shall be willing to stay
execution of the writ.

- 1st That the sum of £100. be paid off
the interest now in arrear, either
by accepted bills which may be
owing by us to him, or in cash.
- 2nd That the Rents of Norper House
Buckham Lodge, and Grove Place

be collected by us, and that the amounts
received for such after paying outgoings
rates and taxes, including cost of
collection, be applied to paying
off the interest, that an account
of same be rendered annually
and the balance if any, be
applied to the reduction of the
Principal.

3rd That Trollope enters into an
Agreement for paying £100 per
annum for occupation of
the Buckfield, Grove house and
Workshops in Grove Lane, in
quarterly instalments, to date from
1st Oct. last, this rent to be added
to the above interest and applied

in the same manner. Also that
in consideration of his making
Bricks, a royalty be paid on
Every 1000 turned out, the
amount of such to be agreed upon
and applied to the deduction of
Interest and principal as

4th That Trollope pays for work we
are able to put in his hands
be rendered quarterly, and
payment of such be made by
applying such amounts to the
deduction of Principal.

5th That the legal expenses incurred
in the matter of the will, be paid
by Trollope.

The proposal was made, and

accepted on the understanding
that the Bank are not going to
press him -

Kindly communicate all
with him and get matters settled
as soon as possible

In view of you wished, we leave
it to you to instruct you
to proceed to get a judgment
against him -
